#### Michigan LICA Attends National LICA's Inaugural Water Management Forum

This summer, during the National LICA Summer Meeting held in Pittsburgh, Region III VP Adam Cook, alongside other prominent LICA leaders,




participated in an engaging leadership panel. The panel aimed to educate and inspire LICA members, offering valuable insights on what it takes to be part of LICA's leadership team.

Our group stayed at the Omni William Penn Hotel, a historic landmark in downtown Pittsburgh. Built in 1916, the hotel offered a luxurious and

A particularly moving tour was the visit to the Flight 93 National Memorial in Shanksville, PA. near Heinz Field, the statue stands as a reminder of Rogers' profound impact on generations of children through his show *Mister Rogers' Neighborhood*. For many, it was a nostalgic moment that brought back memories of Rogers' timeless lessons on kindness, empathy, and community, making it a fitting addition to the meeting's itinerary.



Another highlight of the meeting was a ride on the Duquesne Incline, one of Pittsburgh's oldest and most beloved attractions. Dating back to 1877, the incline takes passengers up Mount





#### Common Driving Procedures: Turns and Intersections

Do you ever get nervous when trying to make a left turn in a large work vehicle? Do you get confused as to who has the right of way when pedestrians are waiting to cross the street? Since the engineering of American roads and city streets can vary significantly from place to place, it is sometimes confusing for drivers to know what to do. However, there are some general rules that apply to most major roadways.

#### **Left Turns**

Generally, motorists recognize left turn lanes by signage or arrows painted on the pavement. On many major streets, left turn lanes are separated from other lanes with concrete barriers.

If you are attempting to make a left turn, it is important that you watch out for opposing traffic, traffic making right turns from the other direction, and cyclists and pedestrians also on the road.

- Avoid drifting into other lanes when making a left. Turn into the closest lane possible or the one that is designated for you (if there are multiple left turn lanes).
- If you are turning left from a two-way street into a one-way street or vice versa, turn from the far-left lane into any available lane.
- When making a left at a light-regulated intersection, assume that the oncoming traffic does not stop unless you have a leftturn arrow signal.

 Never enter an intersection to take a left turn on a red light for any reason.

#### **Right Turns**

Vehicles can make right turns at any time, unless there is a "No Turn on Red" sign present or when other traffic is passing through.

When making a right turn, be cautious of other vehicles going straight from the perpendicular direction or those turning left into the lane you wish to enter. Also exercise extreme caution around pedestrians and cyclists.

#### Intersections

Stop at the first white line marked on the pavement at lighted intersections. Avoid stopping between the white lines, as a crosswalk is specifically designed only for pedestrians.

If there are no lines at the intersection, then stop so as not to block the turning or crossing traffic.

As a general rule, never enter an intersection on a red light for any reason. Also, refrain from entering the intersection if it is backed up by other traffic or if pedestrians are crossing.

#### Many Americans Remain Unfamiliar With 988

The 988 Suicide and Crisis
Lifeline (988 Lifeline) was
launched nationwide in July
2022. The three-digit dialing
code replaced the original 1800 number to make it easier to
remember and access. Like
dialing 911 for medical
emergencies, people in
emotional distress or suicidal
crisis can call or text 988 to
connect with counselors who
will listen, provide support and
connect them to resources.

Since 988 Lifeline's launch two years ago, counselors have answered over 10 million calls, texts and chats. Despite the volume, a new poll by the National Alliance on Mental Illness revealed that most Americans remain unfamiliar with 988. Two-thirds (67%) of Americans said they are aware of 988, meaning they've at least heard of it, but only onequarter (23%) are at least somewhat familiar with 988. Additionally, nearly half of Americans (45%) say they wouldn't feel safe calling 911 for help if their loved one was having a mental health crisis, emphasizing the importance of having a separate dialing code specific for mental health concerns.

### Spread the Word About 988

Now in its second year, the 988 Lifeline continues to help millions of Americans.

According to the poll, people who are familiar show stronger trust in and the likelihood of using the 988 Lifeline. This highlights the need for increased public awareness and education.

The easy-to-remember dialing code provides immediate and accessible care to anyone experiencing mental health-related distress, including thoughts of suicide, mental health and substance use crises, and other emotional struggles. An online chat is also available. 988 Lifeline voice, text and chat options are offered in English and Spanish.

It's vital to continue spreading the word about 988. Keep in mind that people can also call, text or chat if they are worried about a loved one who may need immediate support.

#### A High-fat Diet May Increase Anxiety

When feeling stressed, you may instinctively reach for junk food, which is often high in fat.

However, a new study at the University of Colorado Boulder revealed that consuming high-fat foods might actually worsen anxiety symptoms. Researchers believe this is happening due to the connection between gut bacteria and brain chemicals that regulate anxiety levels.

Experts recommend supporting the gut microbiome and signaling pathways through healthy eating and reducing high-fat and overly processed food intake. Consider incorporating the following foods into your daily diet:

- Foods with omega-3 fatty acids: Fatty fish, flaxseeds, chia seeds, walnuts and avocado
- Foods rich in fiber: Beans, lentils, sweet potato and whole grains
- Fermented foods: Kimchi, miso, tempeh, kombucha, kefir and yogurt
- Prebiotic foods: Garlic, onions, asparagus, bananas and oats
- Dark leafy greens:
   Spinach, kale, arugula,
   Swiss chard and collard greens

 Berries: Raspberries, strawberries and blueberries

Not all fats are bad; they can actually be good for your brain, so try to prioritize the consumption of healthy fats.

Consider these food swaps:

- Replace full-fat dairy products with low-fat or nondairy alternatives.
- Choose whole grains instead of refined grains.
- Swap high-sugar desserts for a small piece of dark chocolate with at least 70% cocoa content.
- Substitute butter with olive or avocado oil.

These findings about the mindbody connection emphasize the need to consider dietary choices beyond weight management. For guidance on nutrition and mental health, contact a qualified medical provider.

- 1. Place chicken breasts into the bottom of a 5 quart or larger slow cooker.
- 2. Season chicken with salt and pepper.
- 3. Whisk the gravy mix, broth & chicken soup together in a small bowl and pour on top of the chicken breasts.
- 4. Cover and cook on high for 3-4 hours or low for 6-8 hours. Adjust salt and pepper to taste.
- 5. Garnish with minced fresh parsley. Serve immediately over mashed potatoes or rice or keep on warm until ready to serve, enjoy!

- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 12-ounce can of evaporated milk
- 3 large eggs
- 1 15.25-ounce box of yellow cake mix
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans
- · 12 tablespoons of butter thinly sliced

#### Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees, and then grease your 9x13 baking dish with cooking spray and set to the side.
- 2. Next in a medium bowl whisk up your pumpkin puree, brown sugar, pumpkin spice, and salt. Mix well.
- 3. Add in the eggs and evaporated milk. Mix to combine fully. Then pour the mixture into the prepared pan.
- 4. Dump the yellow cake mix on top in an even layer. Then sprinkle the top of the cake mix with the chopped pecans.
- 5. Slice your butter into small pieces and place on top of the cake in an even
- 6. Bake for 1 hour 10 minutes or until the cake is baked all the way through. Stick a toothpick in the center of the cake and make sure it comes out clean of wet batter.
- 7. Let the cake set for 10 minutes to cool. Then slice and serve. Refrigerate any leftover cake you do not eat right away.


